nullaki wilderness

DESCRIPTION

A quiet peaceful ride along the edge of the Wilson Inlet and through the Nullaki Wilderness Reserve to Anvil Beach. It is well worth the drive to the starting point.

The road meanders through the Wilderness Reserve where native fauna are protected from non - indigenous feral animals and there are nesting places for sea eagles and many other species of bird life.

On the way the route diverts into Nullaki Drive to a pretty sheltered boat ramp on the Inlet.

There are lovely karri and peppermint forests on the route to Anvil Beach and some spectacular views along the way. Visit Cosy Corner, Shelley Beach, Mutton Bird Island and other scenic attractions on the drive back.

Anvil Beach – and lookout with spectacular views west past William Head and over the Southern Ocean.


Cosy Corner Café, 256 Cosy Corner Road (08) 9845 1000 (2.5 kms off Lower Denmark Road).

ROUTE DIRECTIONS

Start: Youngs Siding on Lower Denmark Road. Youngs Siding is a tiny settlement 36 kms west of Albany and 18.5 kms from Denmark.

- 1. Ride along the Lower Denmark Road towards Denmark. After 1.4 kms turn left into Eden Road.
- 2. Follow Eden Road around the edge of Youngs Lake and Wilson Inlet.
- 3. At the entrance to Nullaki Wilderness Reserve, press the button to open the gate and pass through. The gate helps protect native fauna in the Reserve from non-indigenous feral animals.
- 4. Continue along Eden Road which veers to the left across the Nullaki Peninsula.
- 5. After 2.7 kms you can turn right into Nullaki Drive. After another 2.6 kms there is a small signpost on the right to a jetty and boat ramp on the Wilson Inlet. It's a pretty and protected place for a break. Return back to Eden Road.
- Continue along Eden Road to Anvil Beach on the southern side of the Peninsula. There is a lookout and steps leading down to a beautiful white sandy beach. Take care swimming as there are often extra large waves and rips.
- 7. Return the same way to the starting point.


















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
